The progress at the project is really good. As you can see they have completed the digging of the latrine pit and are now building the tank. The pit is over 12 feet deep and was dug manually using pick axes and shovels with all 24 cubic metres of spoil being removed by a bucket and rope system.



I have just sent further funds so we should be able to complete the building by mid-November. Plumbing work will begin when more funds are available, hopefully, in the near future. We hope to complete the project ready for the January term.
