With sponsorship from Brethertons Solicitors and Banbury Heating Supplies on Wednesday we began work to construct a 3 cubicle toilet block with water harvesting and a handwash station.

The pit is 12feet x 8 feet and will be dug to an approximate depth of 12 feet. This will all be done by pick and shovel and the guys will remove 33 cubic metres of soil. Yesterday I sent some money so that this weekend they can start to make the concrete blocks to form the septic tank. Photos were taken on Thursday evening – just 2 days!
