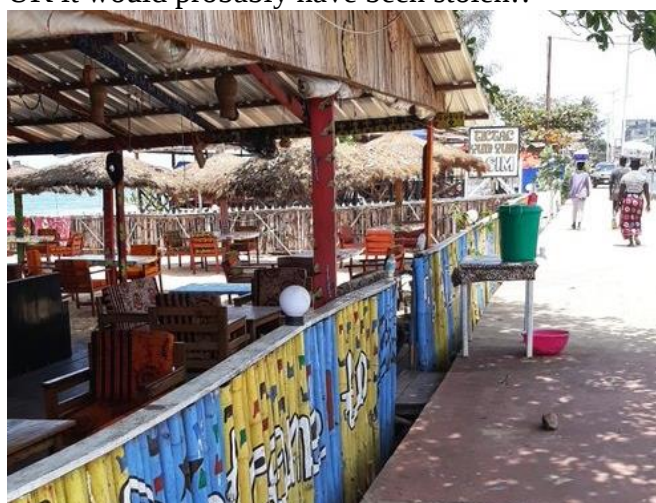


Covid-19 & Sierra Leone
