Liverpool Community School, Waterloo

Due to increasing numbers the school has, on their own initiative, built 2 temporary classrooms for the juniors. As you can see, they are very basic and I don't believe they will withstand the rainy season which starts at the end of May. I have just received a detailed estimate to construct the same size classrooms from concrete blocks, with concrete floors and a corrugated tin roof and could complete and equip these 2 rooms for **JUST £5,200**.

We can reduce the normal cost by utilising the existing two whitewashed walls that you see in both the pictures. As I have other commitments at the moment, I am going to launch an appeal to try and raise the funds and complete the work in 3 phases. Phase 1 - concrete walls and roof will cost **£3,100**. Phase 2 concreting floors, doors, windows, ceilings and painting is another **£1,400** and Phase 3 - equipment, is another **£700**. IF I can complete Phase 1 before May, they will have a watertight facility and anything else will be a bonus.
